This is a hand-written ledger book containing records pertaining to the care of the poor in the Town of Litchfield. It is in very good condition. It contains, but is not limited to, payments between the Town of Litchfield and other Towns for the support of the poor within their borders; contracts between the Town of Litchfield and various Keepers of the Poor for the care of paupers within the Town; agreements for the support of specific individuals; agreements for the operation and management of the Town's Poor Farm; a record of the purchase of the Poor Farm from Robert L. Gilman; and records of the supplies purchased by various managers of the Poor Farm.

Due to the arrangement of the book it is not indexed.

This book was cataloged, microfilmed and digitized in 2012 as a project of the Historical Society of Litchfield, ME and was funded in part by the Maine State Archives' Historical Records Collections Grant Program
